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Introduction

Ontario, Yours To Pollute is the Sierra Legal Defence Fund's third annual report on wastewater discharge violations by Ontario's industrial and municipal facilities. The information presented in this report was obtained from the Ministry of the Environment (MOE or Ministry) under the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act. This information was provided after a 16-month battle that resulted in an Order from the Ontario government's own Information and Privacy Commission requiring MOE to release the information to Sierra Legal free of charge.

Sierra Legal's two previous reports on Ontario's wastewater dischargers revealed that the total number of violations of Ontario's wastewater laws tripled between 1996 and 1998. This report provides an analysis of the recently released MOE data, showing that violations in 1999 stayed at that same high level and that many of the violating facilities continued to exceed wastewater limits in 2000. The report is based on the most recent data available from the MOE.

This research also revealed that the MOE laid charges against only 6 of 168 violating facilities for exceeding wastewater discharge limits in 1999 – and only 11 facilities since 1995. Given the more than 10,000 violations that have occurred by approximately 480 facilities during the same period, it appears that the MOE's continued reliance on 'voluntary' action from violators has proven to be an extremely ineffective method to ensure compliance with the law.

This report begins with a review of the difficulties encountered in retrieving the information for the report and provides a brief overview of Ontario's wastewater laws. The remainder of the report summarizes the MOE data and highlights Ontario's worst wastewater violators – including the 'Filthiest Four' polluters for 1999 and the province's most notorious repeat offenders.

Ontario, Yours To Pollute also provides investment information for all publicly held companies in the top 50 polluters of 1999. We encourage citizens concerned about the effects these companies have on our shared water resources to consider this report in making investment decisions. We also encourage concerned citizens to phone, fax or write these companies and express your concern and ask that they clean up their act.

This report also provides information on how to contact local MOE district offices. Concerned individuals can contact the MOE district office shown in the table and speak to the district manager and tell him or her how you feel. You can ask them to get tough with these polluters and prosecute them for their violations. You can point out that in many cases years of 'voluntary abatement' measures have proven ineffective.

Ministry Ordered to Release Non-compliance Information

The information presented in this report was obtained from the Ministry of the Environment under the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act. This information was provided after a 16-month battle that resulted in an Order from the Ontario government's own Information and Privacy Commission (IPC) requiring MOE to release all information regarding non-compliance with provincial wastewater limits to Sierra Legal free of charge.

In its decision, the IPC found that the MOE has been consistently unable to disseminate information on public health issues in a "comprehensible fashion," and asserted that watchdog organizations such as Sierra Legal provide an important public service protecting Ontarians from secretive government agencies unwilling to disclose information on public health issues.1

This ongoing struggle for information began in 1997, when Sierra Legal first requested MOE data on the non-compliance of provincial wastewater limits. Each subsequent year, Sierra Legal has been forced to go through lengthy appeal processes after Ministry officials attempted to extract enormous fees from the non-profit organization for obtaining public documents and data – and each time, through appeals to the IPC, the MOE has been forced to release the information free of charge.

As a result of Sierra Legal's work, the MOE now reports on municipal and industrial noncompliance through their web site, but the quality of the information continues to be woefully inadequate. The reports posted on their site do not provide any information with respect to the *number* of violations by each facility, or the total number of violations in the province. Furthermore the MOE omits many dischargers from their report - in essence, misleading the public.

Breaking the Law: Wastewater Non-Compliance

This report discusses non-compliance with provincial laws governing industrial and municipal wastewater discharges, and with non-compliance standards set by a facility's certificate of approval or provincial objectives and guidelines. Wastewater discharge is regulated by a set of nine regulations under the Environmental Protection Act (EPA), referred to as the Municipal Industrial Strategy for Abatement (MISA) regulations. MISA regulations set pollutant limits for wastewater discharged by industrial facilities. Similarly, Certificates of Approval, which are issued under the EPA or the Ontario Water Resources Act (OWRA), also establish limits for pollutants being discharged by a facility. In some cases, reports of municipal discharger non-compliance may be of objectives and/or guidelines and not legally enforceable standards. Similarly, in some cases reports of industrial non-compliance prior to the establishment of the MISA regulations may be of

quidelines or objectives. In this report, the violations noted are when companies exceed these limits. All information regarding violations is based on data obtained from the MOE through Freedom of Information (FOI) requests and IPC appeal orders.

There are hundreds of facilities in Ontario that must abide by wastewater discharge limits set by MISA regulations or certificates of approval. However, each year there are facilities that seem to consistently violate those rules and discharge harmful pollutants into Ontario's waters. Many of these facilities are repeat offenders in that they consistently violate the wastewater discharge limits year after year with impunity.

This report profiles all companies that had more than 10 violations of wastewater discharge standards in 1999. Of the 168 industrial violators of Ontario's wastewater discharge laws in 1999, 50 of the facilities had 10 or more violations, and this report focuses on those facilities and their history of non-compliance. This level of noncompliance was chosen as a cut off point for two reasons; (1) it helps focus attention on chronic violators, and (2) this level of violations cannot simply be explained as unusual "accidents" or a "glitches in the treatment system".

Although Sierra Legal had requested information pertaining to legal actions pursued by the MOE against facilities in violation of the wastewater limits, a review of the MOE materials provided under the FOI process showed that there was no reference made to prosecutions or charges being laid. Instead, this information was retrieved by searching MOE media releases for announcements of any charges related to wastewater discharge violations. When MOE officials were contacted to verify these figures, Sierra Legal was informed that this information is not readily available and could only be retrieved through another FOI request. Sierra Legal did initially request this information through an FOI request. However, it was not provided to us and we have therefore estimated the number of charges laid by reviewing all MOE press releases pertaining to charges laid for violations in 1999.

The tables included in this report detail non-compliance information for 1999, but also refer to available MOE non-compliance information for 2000. The MOE has still not released non-compliance data from 2000 to Sierra Legal, but has simply reported on its website whether facilities were in non-compliance in 2000. Thus, this report does not provide numbers of violations for 2000, but does indicate if a facility was in noncompliance during the year 2000.

The report takes the form of a series of tables that list the following information:

- Facilities all 50 facilities with more than 10 violations in 1999 are listed under the MOE Region in which the facility is located.
- **Wastewater Discharge Violations** detailed 1999 non-compliance information for each facility including the pollutants involved and the number of violations for each pollutant.
- **History of Non-Compliance** facility non-compliance information from 1992 to 1999 according to Sierra Legal and MOE reports, and whether the facility was noncompliant in 2000.


- **Investor Information** provides information for publicly held companies such as the stock exchange where the polluting company or a related company is listed and the company's stock symbol.
- **Contact Information** provides information on how a concerned citizen can contact the company that owns the facility, or the facility itself.
- **MOE Action and Contact Info** provides information on what MOE claims it has been doing to deal with the offending parties, as well as information on how to contact the local MOE office that is overseeing the regulatory compliance of the facility.



Discussion and Major Findings

Annual violations have tripled since 1995 - Over 10,000 violations since 1995

Violations by the municipal and industrial sectors in 1999 (the most recent data available from the MOE) continued to be more than triple the number of violations before 1995, as illustrated in Graph 1. As discussed in the previous Sierra Legal reports, there were 1013 violations in 1996, 2234 in 1997 and 3363 in 1998. In 1999 there were an additional 3296 violations of provincial wastewater laws, which brings the total to well over 10,000 violations since 1995. The province has responded during this period by laying charges against only 11 facilities.



Graph 1: Ontario Wastewater Violations 1994-1999

The slight decrease in the level of non-compliance from 1998 to 1999 may be as a result of some money being returned to MOE operations as the annual operating expenditures indicate (see Graph 2). From 1993-94 to 1998-99 the MOE's operating expenditures were slashed by over 45%, from \$390 million to \$142 million. Since 1998, the MOE has seen

slight increases in operating expenditures/budgets each year, however the 2000-01 levels are still less than half of the amount the Ministry was allocated to protect Ontario's environment during the early 1990's.

Comparing the two graphs it is worth noting that non-compliance has generally increased as the MOE operating budget has decreased.

The Filthiest Four Violators

The top four violators in the province of Ontario in 1999 were Chinook Group Limited, Stepan Company, Praxair and Ontario Power Generation. For the second consecutive year, Chinook Group Limited and Stepan Company, both companies that manufacture organic chemicals, had the greatest number of violations of Ontario's wastewater discharge limits. Chinook Group Limited is situated in Sombra (near Sarnia) and violated Ontario's wastewater discharge limits 557 times. Stepan Company is situated in Longford Mills near Orillia and violated Ontario's wastewater limits 537 times. Neither company has been prosecuted for these violations.

With four violating facilities, the American based Praxair had the third largest number of violations in Ontario in 1999 totalling 228. Ontario Power Generation with its eight facilities violating Ontario's wastewater discharge limits 187 times in 1999 was the fourth largest violator.

Chinook Group Limited

Chinook Group Limited has been the number one violator for two years running and appears to have been at it again in 2000. Program Approvals issued by the MOE had protected Chinook Group Limited from prosecution for their 1998-wastewater discharge violations. Under a 'program approval' the company is given time to study the problem and come gradually into compliance while offering the company protection from prosecution for their non-compliance. Chinook was first issued a program approval in April of 1998. The time limit of that program approval was extended twice by the MOE to an expiry date of July 31, 2000.

Documents obtained by Sierra Legal through FOI requests revealed that MOE officials had worked through Christmas and New Year's Eve in 1998 to complete the paper work required to extend Chinook's Program Approval, which was to expire January 1, 1999. Documents obtained also revealed that MOE officials were concerned for the company's liability during the 30-day public comment period during which the company would not be protected from prosecution as the following quote from one MOE memo reveals: "Alternatively, is there some mechanism to give the company protection from prosecution while the [program approval] is on the [Environmental Bill of Rights registry website]?"

Chinook is a privately held company that has been in trouble with the law over their participation in an international cartel that fixed the price of vitamin additives used in animal feed. Chinook plead guilty to charges under the Competition Act and was fined 2.25 million dollars and a former officer of Chinook was sentenced to a nine-month jail term served in the community and was ordered to perform 50 hours of community service.³ Chinook presently faces similar charges in the United States.

Stepan Company

Stepan Company is creating problems in the Ontario communities of Longford Mills and Rama, which are located on the shores of Lake St. John. Stepan discharges its wastewater directly into Lake St. John and local residents, including the Rama First Nation Community, are complaining that the lake has become overrun with weeds. Stepan produces surfactants, soap additives and cleaning agents and has exceeded phosphorus and nitrogen discharge limits on many occasions. Both phosphorus and nitrogen are nutrients that cause excessive plant growth.

Stepan Company is an American based company that had sales totalling almost 700 million dollars in year 2000. Stepan has several facilities around the world and trades on the New York and Chicago Stock Exchange under the symbol SCL.

Stepan also has a spotty international reputation and in Mexico has been accused of dumping its toxic wastewater into open ditches that run through the centre of a rural town. According to the film "Stepan Chemical Poisoning Mexican Communities," the open ditches Stepan is using to get rid of their waste are where the town's children play and residents wash their clothes.

Praxair

With violating facilities in Sarnia, Sault Ste. Marie, Maitland and Mooretown, the American based Praxair had the third largest number of violations in Ontario in 1999 totalling 228. Praxair is a 5 billion dollar inorganic chemical manufacturing company that produces industrial gases, surface coatings and polishing products. Praxair operates in 40 countries and had an operating profit of over 800 million dollars in 2000. Praxair is a public company trading under the symbol PX on the New York Stock Exchange.

Ontario Power Generation

In 1999, Ontario Power Generation (OPG) had eight facilities violating Ontario's wastewater discharge limits: Pickering, Darlington and Bruce Nuclear Generating Stations and Lambton, Nanticoke, Atikokan, Lakeview and Thunder Bay Thermal Generating Stations. These eight facilities violated Ontario's wastewater discharge limits 187 times in 1999. As described in a later section, discharges from two nuclear generating stations were by far the most lethal in Ontario, failing acute lethality tests 77 times during 1999.

The Ontario government wholly owns Ontario Power Generation (Bruce Nuclear is presently being leased to British Nuclear; however in 1999 Bruce was still operated by OPG).

Top Ten Violating Facilities from 1992 to 1999

By summing eight years of non-compliance data, Sierra Legal determined the total number of wastewater discharge violations for each facility from 1992 to 1999. The following table summarizes the top ten violators.

Repeat Offenders

The following facilities have been found to be in non-compliance with Ontario's wastewater discharge limits for at least 5 years running. Our information indicates that none of these has been charged for its offences.

Toxic Violators

Most discharging facilities must conduct monthly 'acute lethality' tests, also referred to as toxicity tests. These tests are conducted by exposing aquatic animals to samples of wastewater under controlled conditions and measuring what percentage of the animals are killed. The two types of acute lethality tests used in Ontario use species named Daphnia magna, a water flea, and fingerling rainbow trout. Each test is conducted for a fixed duration; 48 hours for the *Daphnia magna* and 96 hours for the rainbow trout. The overall level of mortality is determined at the end of the test and if more than 50% of the test species die the test is considered a failure.

In 1999, both Pickering and Darlington nuclear generating stations had numerous acute lethality violations, as well as Inco's Port Colborne refinery and the Canadian Salt Company in Windsor. This means that discharges from these facilities were acutely lethal to aquatic organisms. The following table summarizes the dischargers with 5 or more acute lethality violations.

Pathogen Polluters

Pathogens commonly contained in wastewater include fecal coliform such as Escherichia Coliform (E. coli.), Cryptosporidium and Giardia. The current system of wastewater discharge monitoring typically requires facilities to test for total coliform, fecal coliform or E. coli. It was a strain of E. coli referred to as O157:H7 that was responsible for the deaths in the town of Walkerton in Ontario and Cryptosporidium that contaminated the drinking water in North Battleford, Saskatchewan. Typically the E. coli limit for municipal sewage treatment plant discharge is 200 counts per 100 millilitres of discharge. The following facilities released wastewater in 1999 containing E. coli. in excess of its permitted concentration.



Violations by Industrial Sector

For the second consecutive year the Organic Chemical Sector was the worst violator of Ontario's wastewater discharge laws, largely due to the top two violating companies, Chinook Group Limited and Stepan Company.

Ministry of the Environment's "Action" against Violators

This third annual report continues to demonstrate that many facilities are not responsive to the voluntary abatement strategies advocated by the provincial government. As a result, Ontario's waterways continue to be polluted year after year.

The MOE claims to be working with individual companies to bring about voluntary compliance. However, of the 50 facilities that violated provincial wastewater laws at least 10 times in 1999, 15 of these facilities had been violating the laws for at least 5 consecutive years prior to 1999. Despite this record of non-compliance, the MOE still did not charge any of these facilities in 1999.

One example of MOE's encouragement of voluntary abatement strategies is with the Domtar Inc., Remediation Group. The MOE reported in 1998 that Domtar was "implementing additional site remediation," and in 1999 indicated that a "voluntary abatement program was underway." However, the Domtar facility has been in non-compliance each year since 1992 and had 114 violations in 1999.

Similarly, Cytec Canada has been in non-compliance since 1992 and in 1998 the MOE reported that Cytec was implementing an environmental sensitivity study. In 1999 the MOE reported that an assessment had been completed and that no further studies were required. However, Cytec was again responsible for 140 violations in 1999. How is it that the MOE can believe that "no further action is required" if the facility is still in non-compliance?

Another strategy the MOE has used to manage facilities with wastewater problems is through issuing "Provincial Officer or Director's Orders," but too often these just require the facility to study the problem to determine the source without forcing them to fix the problem in a timely manner.

Even worse than the Ministry's voluntary abatement strategies is the issuance of "Program Approvals", which more or less sanction the non-compliance by offering the facility immunity from prosecution for exceeding the wastewater discharge limits while they "study the problem". Program approvals were infrequently used prior to the election of the present government. They are now used often. We found that the Ministry's non-compliance report does not report many of the facilities discharging wastewater under a program approval. One example is of Chinook Group Limited, the number one violator of wastewater discharge limits in 1999 and 1998; Chinook was not mentioned in the MOE 1999 non-compliance report. We assume this is because the Ministry, or at least some district offices of the Ministry, do not consider violating facilities operating under program approvals to be in non-compliance since a program approval protects the company from prosecution for their wastewater discharge violations.

In the past decade there has also been a litary of research showing that voluntary abatement methods are less effective than enforcement action. One survey assessed

corporate behaviour when financial cost is weighted against environmental harm.⁴ The results indicate: "prosecution has a strong, statistically significant impact upon the environmental behaviour and in predictions of future behaviour." Executive Resources Group reported on a similar survey conducted by KPMG in a paper prepared for the MOE. The paper, titled *Environmental Compliance Assurance: A Review of Best International Practices*⁵ assessed the reason companies implement best environmental practices. The most important reason reported was the "legal duty to comply with regulations, followed by potential for Board of Directors liability".

This research and continued public pressure calling for more responsible enforcement of polluters appears to be getting through to the Government of Ontario. In the last few months the MOE does appear to be more committed to enforcement and has recently laid charges against Stelco, CGC Inc., and Norton Advanced Ceramics for various wastewater discharge offences. Furthermore, there has also been a reported increase in total fines and charges for all types of environmental offences in 2001. We hope that the Government of Ontario has finally come to the realization that the only way to bring some polluters into compliance is by the use of legal actions. Despite these small steps towards improved enforcement, the Ontario government has a long way to go to bring compliance levels up sufficiently to protect our water.

Living Downstream

Recent tragedies in Walkerton, Ontario and North Battleford, Saskatchewan have brought the quality of our drinking water to the forefront of public concern. Water is the lifeblood of the environment and is essential to the survival of all living things. Yet we continue to have problems with the water we drink because we have not protected it from the contaminants produced by industry and government.

Receiving waters polluted by wastewater discharges are potential sources of drinking water to communities and individuals living downstream. Downstream communities have little or no control over the quality of the water entering their jurisdiction but must pay the cost to treat the water such that it is fit for human consumption. Tougher regulation and enforcement of wastewater discharges would better protect downstream users of the water and save consumers millions of dollars in treatment costs (which consumers are paying for through water fees and taxes).

What You Can Do

This report provides investment information for many publicly held companies. We encourage citizens concerned about these violations and the effects they have on our shared water resources to check their portfolios, including the holdings of their mutual funds, to determine if they are investing in one of the companies discussed in this report. We also encourage concerned citizens to phone, fax or write the company and express your concern and ask that they "clean up their act." Similarly, if you are an investor you can let them know whether you would invest in their company given their non-compliance record. If you can, go all the way to the top with your message.

We have also provided information on contacting local MOE district offices. If you are concerned about these polluters, you can telephone the MOE district office shown in the table and speak to the district manager and tell him or her how you feel. You can ask them to get tough with these polluters and prosecute them for their violations. You can point out that in many cases years of abatement measures have proven ineffective.



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


