The role of the Speaker will be chosen by secret ballot of all Members of Parliament once their roles have been established, since a Member with an official Government or House role is ineligible to become Speaker. All remaining Members are candidates for Speaker unless he or she withdraws his or her name from the ballot. To become Speaker, a Member must receive 50% + 1 of the votes cast. If no Member receives a majority of the votes cast, then the Member with the lowest vote count is dropped from the ballot and a subsequent vote is held. This continues until a Member receives a majority of the votes cast.
